USS Indianapolis True Story

stranded in the shark-infested waters.

One intriguing sea stories of the USS Indianapolis, a tragic and harrowing tale from World War II. The USS Indianapolis was a Portland-class heavy cruiser that played a crucial role in delivering components of the atomic bomb used in Hiroshima to Tinian Island. After completing this top-secret mission, the ship sailed on a course toward Leyte in the Philippines. On July 30, 1945, the USS Indianapolis was struck by torpedoes fired from a Japanese submarine, the I-58, in the Philippine Sea. The ship sank in just 12 minutes, leaving approximately 900 sailors

The crew faced extreme conditions: dehydration, exposure, and relentless shark attacks. Due to a series of mishaps, the Navy was unaware of the ship's sinking, and rescue efforts were not initiated promptly. For four days, the survivors struggled to stay afloat, with many succumbing to injuries, exposure, or shark attacks.

Eventually, on August 2, a routine air patrol spotted the survivors by chance and called for rescue. By the time they were discovered, only 316 men were still alive.

The story of the USS Indianapolis remains one of the most tragic and chilling episodes of World War II naval history. The courage, endurance, and the sheer will to survive exhibited by the crew amidst unimaginable circumstances continue to be remembered and honored to this day.

This true story highlights both the resilience of the human spirit and the unforgiving nature of the sea, leaving a lasting impression on the history of naval warfare.

We did NOT have success with the Boating Skills Virtual Trainer this year, despite the numerous hours **Tom Nicholas** put in trying to get it to work. We had to conclude that the CPU died on arrival! These units are aging and are probably no longer suited for strenuous travel. I was able to get our shipping fees refunded from National, since we were unable to get any use out of the device this year. I will be looking for alternatives to make our booth attractive to show visitors.

While in Orlando for the USPS/America's Boating Club Annual Meeting, I spoke with Marty

Lafferty of the America's Boating Channel. He has prepared some video loops specifically for use at boat shows. I have received copies and plan to show at a squadron meeting when we need a fill in program. Chris Foster of Syracuse Squadron (and District Secretary) was in the same conversation with Marty and used the videos at their booth in the Central New York Boat Show. He said the loop on "Boat Fails" really turned heads and got people passing by to stop and talk with them. Sounds promising!

And speaking of the America's Boating Channel, you all have easy access on your Member Home Page on the USPS.org website. There are seven seasons of safe boating related videos, mostly in the 5-10-minute length. If you have a topic for which you want to refresh your memory (and which of us don't!), browse the titles season by season. In addition to all the boating safely topics, there are a variety of nautical related TV shows available, like "McHale's Navy", "Gilligan's Island", "Flipper", "Sea Hunt" and vintage movies like "Mutiny on the Bounty" (Brando version), "The Caine Mutiny", well you get the idea. Education and entertainment, all on the America's Boating Channel!

I also attended a seminar on **Cooperative**

Charting and met some people that would be happy to tell us how to get started on a squadron coop charting program. This is an opportunity for our membership (including those not currently owning boats) to meet up for a worthwhile outdoor boating related activity! Our Vessel Safety Check Committee, P/C Ken **Mart, AP**, has informed me that there is a new CG Aux workshop for Vessel Examiners to be taken by 30 Jun 24.
